In the middle of September, I spent Sunday afternoon and evening at the 2nd Annual Meeting of the 1000 Hills Baptist Association. It was a good time of business, fellowship and worship. Here is a summary of some of the actions taken at the annual business session. First, we have voted to begin a missions partnership with some of the associations of urban northern Chicago. FBC Macon is planning a mission trip in the summer of 2011. Second, we approved an Easter outreach for 2011, called Summit Sunday. You will hear more about that soon.

We had a great time of worship that filled the sanctuary of First Baptist, Kirksville. If you were not there, you missed a great opportunity to worship with our entire associational church family. We are part of a good association that has been focused on outreach and evangelism, such as Operation Kirksville, that has been helpful to bring about growth in our church.

In the past several years, God has truly blessed our church. He has sent us several new members and families. We have seen tremendous growth in some areas of ministry. Since 2004, morning worship has grown over 25%, and based on current attendance, Wednesday has grown over 600%. We have begun new outreach events such as Worship in the Park and the Easter Egg Hunt, and we have seen other ministries take off such as the Women's Ministry. That is humbling. We know it is not us, but God at work in our midst. May we continue to be a church that God can use.

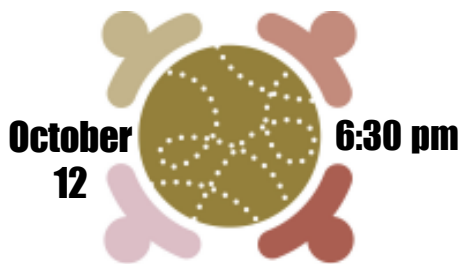

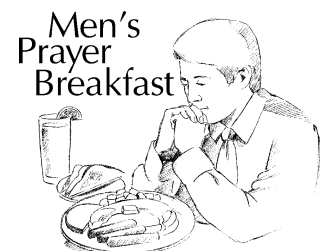
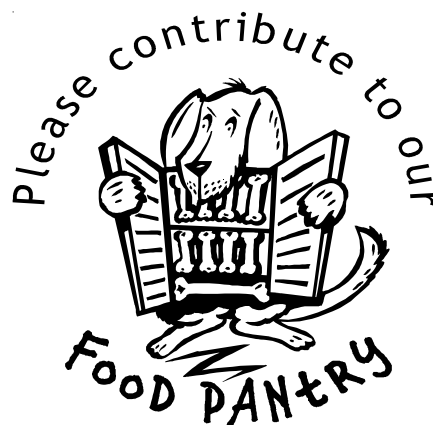

REFUGE CHURCH MISSION PROJECT

Random Conversation About Church Planting part 4....

As church was dismissing, Elmore Gilfish sought out the missions committee member. “Hey, I want to hear more about what is going on with the Refuge Church. I’ve been praying about it, and want to know how God has answered,” said Elmore Gilfish.

“Thanks for asking. It’s been a very interesting time,” replied the missions committee member. “First of all, we put up a banner by the church, advertising the concert. Next, we sent post cards to over 600 families that lived within a 3 mile radius of the church.”

“That’s a lot of postcards – I didn’t realize there were that many households in the area!”

“It’s true. Sometimes we take things for granted and make assumptions that have no basis in reality,” said the missions committee member. “On the 18th, several of us met and we went to different parts of the area to hand out flyers and personally invite people to the concert. That setting is so different from here in Kirksville, as houses are not that close to each other. Folk in the country are more laid back and more ready to chat than are some people here in the ‘metropolis’ of Kirksville.”

“I never thought about how that setting would have its unique challenges and opportunities,” commented Elmore.

“On the morning of the concert, several of us went to the church and cleaned it

up and made sure it was ready for the concert. We sure appreciated Joe Kerby supplying some cleaning supplies for us to use.”

“Well, how did the concert go?” asked Elmore.

“Well, as you know, the Southern Gospel group ‘Renewed’ performed. About 50 people gathered at the church. We collected a love offering to help with the repairs of the roof. That money went straight to the cemetery board. We asked everyone who came to the concert to fill out a card to see if there was interest in restarting the Refuge Church.

“So did you have any interest?” asked Elmore.

“We had several families who expressed interest. At this time we are going to make contact with them and find out more information before we make any more decisions,” commented the committee member. “I’ll let you know after we have gathered more information and our committee has come to a decision.”

“So, I should be praying that God gives y’all wisdom, right?” said Elmore.

“Absolutely!” said the committee member. “Remember what the verse on the bulletin cover says? Go into all the world...”

“Yes, I know that verse. I used to think that was something that happened in

another country, but it is something that happening right here in Northeast Missouri!”

“Exactly! And you know what the next question will be?”

“Where next?” asked Elmore.

“Right!” replied the committee member.

“Guess that will be on my prayer list, too!” replied Elmore.

October is Pastor Appreciation Month.

Maybe you need some ideas on how to encourage our pastor.

Several suggestions are listed here:

1. Pray for your pastor every day.
2. Send an email showing your pastor appreciation to your pastor *and all your friends*. Don't use the blind copy email feature so that everyone's name is listed at the top of the email. He will see that you are truly proud of him.
3. Send him a greeting card with a personal message inside.
4. Give him a hug.
5. Take his wife to lunch.
6. Make yourself available to teach a Sunday School class or work in the nursery during a service.
7. Offer to help fold bulletins.
8. Mow his lawn or shovel his driveway.
9. Visit someone in the hospital.
10. Call a home-bound church member.
11. Call his wife and ask what kind of pizza they like. Order it, pay for it, and have it sent to your pastor's home.
12. Smile a little during his sermon.
13. Call him at an appropriate time and say, "In my bible reading this morning I read that _____. What does that mean?"
14. Drop off some doughnuts, bagels, or fruit to the church office for the entire staff to enjoy.

15. Rent a billboard and use it to express your pastor appreciation.
16. After a sermon, don't tell him it was a great sermon. Pick out something specific from the sermon and comment directly on that. So many people tell him his sermon was "great" that he realizes their comment is the same as an American asking, "How are you?" We don't really mean it ... it's just a greeting.
17. Perform a surprise pastor appreciation skit.
18. Have the 4 – 10 year old children in your church write down their answer to the question, "What does a pastor do?" Read the responses during a service.
19. Write an article for the church newsletter about how thankful you are for your pastor.
20. Support your church financially.
21. Get a group of people together to fast and pray for your pastor.
22. Give him a surprise birthday party.
23. Loan him your boat, four wheeler, or snowmobile.
24. Let his family use your cottage or timeshare.
25. Take him golfing.
26. Buy his entire family tickets to a sporting event.
27. Write a story about your pastor appreciation and read it during a church service.
28. Put an ad in the local newspaper expressing your respect for your pastor.
29. Include a pastor appreciation poem in your Sunday bulletin.
30. On Sunday, ask him what you can pray about for him this week. Then

- next Sunday ask him how things went regarding what you prayed for.
31. If time is given during a service or event for public sharing, talk about something positive your pastor did recently that few people know about.
32. Defend him against critics.
33. Ask someone other than the pastor to pray before the next church meal.
34. "Adopt" one of his children as someone you pray for, encourage, and support.
35. Give him a pastor appreciation gift.
36. Give his wife a gift.
37. Write a letter to your church's leaders expressing your gratitude for your pastor.
38. Listen openly to his ideas for change.
39. Sing your heart out at your church worship service.
40. Keep track of his, his wife's, and his children's birthdays as well as his wedding anniversary.
41. Tell him you appreciate him ... and why.
42. Sit closer to the front during a service.
43. Know the dates of when his parents died. Send him a card on that anniversary.
44. Write a letter of pastor appreciation to your church's denominational headquarters.
45. Never publicly criticize him. If you have a concern or complaint, speak directly to him about it, or better, forgive him and forget it.

Summary of Church Council Agenda Items



Church Council

recently discussed the following items:

- ✠ Ministry Purpose, Strengths, Weaknesses, and interconnectedness were identified.

- ✠ Worship in the Park was evaluated and decided to continue next year.
- ✠ Back to Church Sunday was also evaluated and decided to participate again next year.
- ✠ Discovery Journey Goals for 2010 and 2011 were reviewed and discussed. Goals for 2010 are being met, and progress toward some goals for 2011 is underway.
- ✠ We have been contacted by Jews for Jesus for a possible April 2011

- presentation. This was tabled until October's meeting.
- ✠ The Finance Policy was returned to Church Council for review before the Finance Committee formally presents it to the church.
- ✠ The Music Committee is working toward hosting a fall concert.
