"Can you drive a little straighter?" Grandpa taunted.

I was ten years old and I thought I knew everything about farming. I'd been riding on tractors all my life. Apparently, Grandpa thought that my ego was out of control and that the best way to deflate it was to let me drive... and deflate it he did. My rows were as crooked as the Mississippi river.

"I'm trying, Grandpa!" I whined.

His eyes squinted as he tried to hide a smug grin. "Wanna know how to make a straight row?"

I thought to myself, "Know how? What's to know? Just don't drive crooked, for crying out loud!" But this was my third pass and it was getting worse, so I gave in and mumbled, "Sure."

He pointed to the other end of the field. "See that maple tree over there?"

"You mean the one straight in front of us?" I said. "Yeah, I see it."

Grandpa gave me a determined look and said sternly, "Don't take your eye off of it. Keep your hood ornament lined up with that tree until we get all the way across the field."

I squared myself up in the seat and looked straight ahead. Grandpa told me not to worry if I overlapped or left a skip. "We'll come back and get it after we get our row straightened out," he reassured. When we got to the other end and turned around, I was amazed. That pass was as straight as an arrow flies on a calm day. Grandpa saw it, too. "Now, every time you turn around and start a new pass, look to the other side of the field. Find a tree or a fencepost that lines up with your last pass and drive toward it."

Our fencepost is Jesus.

As Christians, we know that Jesus Christ is what we need to drive toward. but it's easy to get lazy. We must actively focus on Jesus to make our path straight. We can't make straight rows by being passive. God calls us to be proactive about our faith. Hebrews 12:1, 2, 12-16: "Therefore, since we also have such a large cloud of witnesses surrounding us. let us lay aside every weight and the sin that so easily ensnares us. Let us run with endurance the race that lies before us, keeping our eyes on Jesus, the source and perfecter of our faith. Therefore strengthen your tired hands and weakened knees, and make straight paths for your feet, so that what is lame may not be dislocated but healed instead. Pursue peace with everyone, and holiness—without it no one will see the Lord."

As this pertains to our worship, let's commit to come together each week with hearts and minds focused on Jesus Christ in 2014. As you wake up each day, see Jesus as that fencepost on the other end of the field and make a straight path toward Him. You will be strengthened and healed. Begin this year with renewed resolve to pursue peace and holiness. If we do, I'm convinced we will come together in worship and "see the Lord". How awesome would that be? I can't wait to see you Sunday!



I have been asked by several people what my approach to Youth ministry is so I thought it appropriate as I begin my official duties as part-time Youth Minister to share what I conveyed to the search committee...

My philosophy can be summed up by the words of God through Solomon in Proverbs 22:6, "Train a child in the way he should go and when he is old he will not turn from it." and the words of God through Paul in 1 Timothy 4:12, "Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith, and in purity." I do not believe that we have to differ our approach to ministry significantly between adults and youth. I see no examples in scriptures where concessions were made in proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ based on age.

I agree completely with one of the Core Value statements from the editors of the Gospel Project study we are doing now. They state: "We believe it is best to expect a lot out of those who attend a small group or Sunday School class. We don't need to go only as deep as the least knowledgeable person in the group. When a child is still on baby food, a family doesn't stop eating steak and potatoes. As leaders, we want to provide a feast and let people draw the sustenance they need. We may have to 'cut up the meat' for new believers and make sure the truth is accessible. But the key is to put the biblical ingredients together and provide the meal. The important thing is that everyone has been fed and is sufficiently nourished when finished"

My goal is that our Youth come to a saving faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and

King of their lives. My expectation is that they come prepared to hear the word God has prepared for them in whatever form that takes. My approach is to present God's word clearly and relevantly to them at every opportunity.

As we embark on a new year, I pray that 2014 will be a great year for the Youth ministry of HSBC. The Fall semester of 2013 was amazing! God was really working in our midst. We averaged nearly 20 youth each Wednesday night with 5-6 adults. Our Bible study in the Gospel Project challenged each of us to look at how we bear God's image in all aspects of our lives. Over the next few months we will be looking at A God-Centered Worldview.

We will also be meeting shortly to plan some fun activities for the new year to encourage growth and bonding among our Youth. Please continue to pray for our Youth and this ministry. God is at work and we pray for His continued blessings.

Colossians

Christ Is All You Need

January Bible study begins January 15, 2014 at 6:30 p.m. This years' study centers on Colossians and is entitled "Christ is All You Need.". It is a study that will help you experience the abundant life in Christ. Jesus said that He came so that we might "have life and have it in abundance" (John 10:10). This study will help you move away from performance-based religion and step into the freedom of arelationship with Christ.

In order for that to happen, we must see ourselves from God's perspective and learn to rest in what we discover. As we work through Paul's letter to the church in Colossae, we will see that believers are rooted in Him, free in Him, built up in Him, hidden in Him, complete in Him, forgiven in Him, and seated with Him. We are secure in Christ because "the entire fullness of God's nature dwells bodily in Christ" (2:9). Our life is in Christ, and He lives through us.

If you are tired of performancebased religion, this study is for you. If you are overwhelmed by religious routines and if you are searching for the abundant life, take this journey through Colossians.

The church there would like for us to lead a Sports Camp, Back Yard Bible Clubs, Service projects and possible Block Party.

Just as a football team gets itself in shape to play a game, we too want to make sure our team goes in the best spiritual state possible. There are a few requirements:

- 1) Be at worship at least 80% of the time (work schedules will be taken into consideration)
- 2) Be at Bible study at least 80% of the time (Sunday school or other Bible study)
- 3) Application filled out to explain your calling for wanting to go on the trip
- 4) A mandatory 1 hour class on witnessing and sharing your testimony to be offered late Spring

Be praying about if this is for you or not. We need to have 8-10 adults who are committed to going before we commit to going to the church in Grand Island. On **Monday, January 6 at 7 pm** we will have a meeting at church to find out who is ready to commit and if we are able to go to Grand Island. If you are ready to commit but are not able to make the meeting, be sure to contact David Cook or Pastor Charles.

Miscellaneous Info about Grand Island:

- Census data says that of the population of around 50,000: 12% are conservative evangelical Christian, 45% Lutheran, 35% Catholic, 8% other (Muslim, Jewish, Mormon). Even though many claim a religious affiliation, 28.8% may claim a religion have no church affiliation, which means they don't attend church at all!
- 80-85% of young adults aged 20-40 said the traditional church is irrelevant to their lives!
- The school district says that there are 53 recognized ethnic groups in their schools. Of the 50,000 people population, 68.6% are white, 26.7% are Hispanic, 1.8% are African (lots of Sudanese and Somalian) and 1.1% Asian. All the rest are less than 1%.

Beacon of Hope is a new church start that had its first worship service on Easter Sunday 2010. There are about 25 people who attend on a Sunday morning. The pastor is looking for people to come and work beside his people and help them learn ministry, as they are all new to the faith. The pastor has also started a Hispanic church in Grand Island as well as a Hispanic Church in Hastings, which is about 30 miles away.

Remember, Monday, January 6 at 7 pm we will have a meeting to see who is ready to commit.

If you would like to donate aluminum cans to the Youth, place them in Doug Athon's pick up bed on Sunday mornings. Doug drives a green Ford Ranger pickup.
