

## A Note from the Minister of Music



### TENSILE STRENGTH

When a new highway loop was being completed in West Michigan, a real danger was discovered. The bridges had been designed to bear their own weight—but not the weight of the traffic they would be carrying. Before the highway could be opened, several bridges had to be re-engineered and rebuilt.

Engineers have to be especially concerned with the tensile strength of the material in their construction plans for structures that are required to bear large amounts of stress due to weight. Tensile strength is the maximum amount of stretching a material can withstand before it tears. If the engineer miscalculates, the structure may collapse under the pressure.

When we are under the weight of stress and hardship, we may wonder whether our Lord, who engineered us, has miscalculated our personal “tensile

strength.” We are certain that we are going to collapse under the weight of the trials, but our Designer knows exactly what we can handle by His grace. He knows our limits and will never permit more than we can bear.

Turn to God for His strength and comfort. Reinforced by the steel of God’s provision, our tensile strength won’t fail!





# **FAMILY MINISTRY**

*Making the faith intentional and relevant*



One of the things I love about summer is sitting by the pool while my boys take swimming lessons! It's a time to relax, think, and read. The boys love learning to swim, and at times they are like little fish! Several times this summer their instructor took them to the 9' part of the pool. They had floatation belts around their waists, but it was stretching them in their comfort zone.

On the last two days of lessons, they went to the 9' part without their belts, and were to dive in the pool from a sitting position, then swim back to the side. They weren't far from the edge, so it wasn't a big deal. Their teacher was with them the whole time. Then it was time that they could go off the diving board. Cedric went to get a floatation belt, but Skyler decided he was going to jump off without the belt. I was sitting at the 3' end of the pool. While he was waiting in line, I wondered if I should go over and tell him to put on a belt. I debated if I should go over and remind the instructors that he had never gone off the diving board by himself before.

The image kept running in my mind of when we were in Omaha a few weeks earlier. I had taken the boys to the pool at the hotel. Skyler had reached a deeper part of about 4', and he started to flounder and go under. Cedric yelled out, and I swam over and got him to the side. It had scared us both. That image was still in my mind and wondered about

if he was really ready to jump off into 9' of water and swim to the side when he couldn't do that in 4' of water a few weeks earlier.

By now he was about at the board, and I was sitting up in my chair. I decided to sit back and watch from a distance. There were 3 swimming instructors near right there, and I had to trust that his instructor was confident enough that he could do it, and that he himself was confident enough to do the jump without the belt. I watched as Skyler jumped in, came up, splashed a little – and swam to the side!

Needless to say, I was quite proud of him, and he was quite proud of his jump, too! I was glad that I had stayed on the sidelines and just watched to see what would happen. Had I been running over and telling him to put the belt on, he would have missed an opportunity to grow. I also would have missed an opportunity in learning to trust that he was ready.

Something like swimming is not that big of deal when compared to other situations in life, such as teaching our kids' internet use, who to date, when to start dating, curfew, etc. There needs to be boundaries, and yet, there are times that those boundaries need to be gradually removed, and the parents step back to see what happens. We need to give our children the guidelines as well as instill in them why we have the boundaries set in the way we have them.

Then there comes a time when we have to step back and see what choices they make. Often times there seems to be two mistakes that parents often make, and they are both on the extremes. One is not setting any types of boundaries, and the kid is in a freefall, and the other type is what is known as a "helicopter parent", where they are hovering about and not giving any chance of freedom.

It makes me think back to Adam and Eve in the garden. God set some boundaries and stepped back to see

what would happen. God does the same to us, too. He sets some boundaries, and then looks to see what happens.

I don't know about you, but I am so much happier to obey God (or my boss or supervisor) when I understand the why behind it. We need to realize that it is true for our kids, too.

On September 21, Wendy Kerby will be leading a discussion during Sunday School on how to set boundaries, as well as when to take them away. Come join this one-time class to help encourage you on a direction to help our kids navigate through life.

# Summary of Church Council Agenda

## Items



Church Council recently discussed the following topics:

*Office Remodel* – We are looking for someone who can do knockdown. Once that has been taken care of, work should progress rather quickly to completion. Until the knockdown has been applied, Tuesday night work is suspended.

*Policy Development Dealing with Cohabitation of Members* – The panel submitted a constitutional revision & policy for review because they thought it best to solidify the by-laws and use the policy for the details. The Constitution section had not comments or concerns. There was discussion on some of the policy. The writing team will make revisions and return with an updated policy next month.

*Worship in the Park* – Tent set up will begin 2 pm Saturday afternoon after the Mobile Food Pantry distribution. It was noted that we need more help, especially with take down. Sign-up sheets will be made available for tent set up, furniture & equipment set up, and take down for both. The Youth and adults will be painting car windows this Sunday. Pastor Charles has done an interview with KLTE which they have aired once and will air again. He is scheduled for KIRX's Area Scene on Tuesday, and Wednesday, Vanessa Alonzo from KTVO will be doing a pre-Worship in the Park interview.

*Nominating Committee* – Of the two candidates who were contacted last

month, one declined and one is still contemplating it. Therefore no action was taken at this time.

*Food 4 Kids Evaluation* – It was noted that Rotary Park did not have any one come, but we had workers in every park. The Food 4 Kids program leaders discontinued the Rotary Park site the week after we served. It was agreed that Food 4 Kids leadership should be procured earlier.

*Church Directory* – We have received the necessary information to add the on-line link to our web site for sign ups; paper sign-up sheets will be in the foyer this week as well. We still need to develop a method of promotion to the community.

*Movie Night Sunday Nights* – Discussion about our recent movie nights and Sunday Night services concluded with agreement to have one movie night a month. In September, the 7<sup>th</sup> we will have regular service, 14<sup>th</sup> is dismissed for the associational meeting, 21<sup>st</sup> is Business Meeting, 28<sup>th</sup> will be Movie Night with the movie still to be determined. The staff will develop a plan for future Sunday nights, then submit it to Church Council for review.

*Harvest America* – This is a free nationwide evangelistic outreach simulcast with Greg Laurie from Dallas, Texas, on Sunday evening, October 5. We will discuss this more at next month's meeting.

*October Fall Fest* – David Cook said he has some ideas for decorating that we could begin in advance, and asked for October 19 and 26 to be decorating days. It was noted the Mobile Food Pantry will be held October 25, and any decorations put within arms' reach would not withstand the day. It was agreed for decorations to be put up as long as they are out of reach.

*Christmas Event* – Partnering with Curtain Call Theater was discussed.

Kevin Martin volunteered to lead the discussion with them.

*WMU* – We will evaluate this ministry at the next meeting. In the absence of WMU, the Missions Committee would take the responsibility for the three special missions offerings. Church Council set a tentative goal for the Rheubin L. South Missouri Missions Offering in the event the Missions Committee is unable to meet prior to September. It was agreed to set the goal at \$1,600, then if the Missions Committee meets & would like to change the goal they may do so.

*Evening Services Dismissed* – It was agreed to recommend evening services be dismissed as follows:

- § Sunday, September 14 – THBA Annual Meeting
- § Wednesday Evening, October 29 – Fall Festival
- § Wednesday Evening, November 26 – Thanksgiving
- § Wednesday Evening, December 31 – New Year's Eve


